Connect

Connect is a year-long personal development programme that continues Jesus's strategy by training people to get alongside others, and seeing what God does. It consists of two elements, an Internship with the Navigators and a Training Programme. Most people do both but it is possible to do one or the other. Our prayer is that these individuals would grow in their intimacy with Jesus and ministry skills that will set them up for following Jesus in all of life. For over twenty years Connect has proven itself to be highly significant in the lives of both the interns who take

part and the lives of those they go on to influence in the rest of life.

Investing in you

Our vision is that there will be alongsiders spreading and deepening Jesus' influence next door to everywhere. We want you to be part of this vision so we will invest in you through:

Internship

The Navigators provide a range of internships working alongside experienced representatives in a local setting in the UK, with on-the-job skills training. These provide opportunities and experiences to share with others the impact Jesus has had on your own life, help others to follow him for themselves and to point people to a deeper relationship with Jesus. It may also be possible to arrange alternative internships, for example in a local church or youth work charity that shares the Navigators' values.

Training programme

You will set out on a journey of personal study through engaging deeply with the Bible, helpful resources, interactive residential training days, and assignments designed to stretch your knowledge, faith and skills.

Personal development

Through both the Internship and the Training Programme you will be developed in your own spiritual growth, helping you to build character and convictions that enable you to make a significant contribution to God's vision beyond Connect.

All this while also providing a great set of transferable skills that would be highly valuable on any CV.

We'd love you to join us on this adventure and we are excited about what God is going to do in and through you.

The majority of Connect is spent working within an internship in a local setting in the UK, apprenticed to a Navigator representative. You may focus on working within a variety of community groups, including young families, secondary school youth, university students, international

students, the arts, and particular geographical areas and cross-cultural settings.

Who could you work with?

Real transformation

The Navigator's aim is not to achieve mere knowledge or surface-level spirituality, but to be transformed deeply by God's Spirit. We believe God chooses to do this through one life influencing another as they engage with His word and seek Him in prayer. Transformation occurs as alongsiders develop alongsiders.

This is why the Internship is a key element of the Connect year. It provides you with an opportunity to be mentored by and learn alongside others, while equipping you to fully engage with and invest well in the lives of others.

You will grow in your own personal faith journey, your love for God, his Word and people, and by being trained to walk alongside others to help them to also grow.

You will be paired with a mature overseer to help you navigate and make the most of everything you are experiencing and learning.

Through reflecting on both the Internship and the Training Programme, Connect aims to grow your confidence in evangelism, both as an 'outsider' ministering to people beyond your natural sphere of relationships and as an 'insider' within key communities and with key individuals in your everyday life.

Training Programme



In tandem with the Internship is a nationally run structured Training Programme, which together fulfill the Connect training objectives shown in the diagram opposite. The Training Programme is delivered with an appreciation of a variety of different learning styles and is made up of a number of components. Each of these components combine to create a diverse experience that give a well-rounded learning environment to grow and develop.

Training modules

A five-module course, designed to explore and unpack what it means to follow Jesus as we come alongside others, is completed over the course of the year and covers:

- 1 Joining God's Mission
- 2 The Call to Go
- 3 Gospel Transformation
- 4 Alongsiders in All of Life
- 5 Next Door to Everywhere

In order to make disciples, we have to be disciples. Each module seeks to address both of these dynamics concurrently and consists of the following components:

- ▢ Summary article: unpacking the theme and heart of the module
- ▢ Reading project: exposing you to a wealth of writers and thinkers
- ▢ Experiential component: putting into practice different ministry skills
- ▢ Handling the Bible: discovering tools for correctly handling the Bible
- ▢ Bible study: exploring the Bible in depth, complemented by a range of talks, videos, articles and practical assignments

- ▢ Reflective essay: summarising what you're learning in a 1000-word essay

Training days

Four times a year Connect interns come together for three days to share and learn from one another, participate in training seminars and to allow space and time to slow down, reflect on and share experiences with one another.

Ministry visit

You will have the opportunity to visit at least one other Navigator ministry. This provides a broader experience and allows you to observe different ways of doing ministry.

National conferences

There are a number of national Navigator events such as the National Conference, National Student Conference, Scottish Summer School and NavNetwork that you will be invited to attend.

Retreats

Connect provides a unique opportunity to build habits and develop a deep and rich devotional life through taking time to be with God.

Summer training programme

At the end of the Connect year, you will join an overseas trip that exposes you to the Navigator vision and God's heart in a different culture. This will take you out of your comfort zone and hence sharpen your faith and character, broaden your horizons and develop an outwardly focused heart for the nations.

Final roundup

To finish off there will be a final day to review what God has been teaching you over the year and to refocus towards your next steps.

Personal Development

It is important to make a better *contribution* as we serve God by developing in key *competencies* such as practical skills and strategy. However, the best *contribution* will be made as we develop a *character* that flows from deep Biblical *convictions* and a vibrant relationship with *Christ*. Connect seeks to build on each of these components both through the Internship and the Training Programme.

The Navigators are passionate about the good news of Jesus and his influence in the world. We have a burden to see generations of workers living and coming alongside those who don't follow Him.

- Connect is your chance to join a new generation of leaders by taking part in a one-year faith adventure to see God at work around you and to lay foundations for a whole life of working with Christ, wherever he may take you.
- Connect is an unprecedented opportunity to be apprenticed to a Navigator representative in their local setting, sharing real life with them, contributing significantly to the spiritual lives of others, all underpinned with a focus on foundational development in your own life.
- Connect will be a significant and challenging year. People speak of

growing in character and faith, a deepened relationship with God and substantial personal development in maturity and skill. This growth often comes from walking a bumpy path and facing difficult challenges along the way.

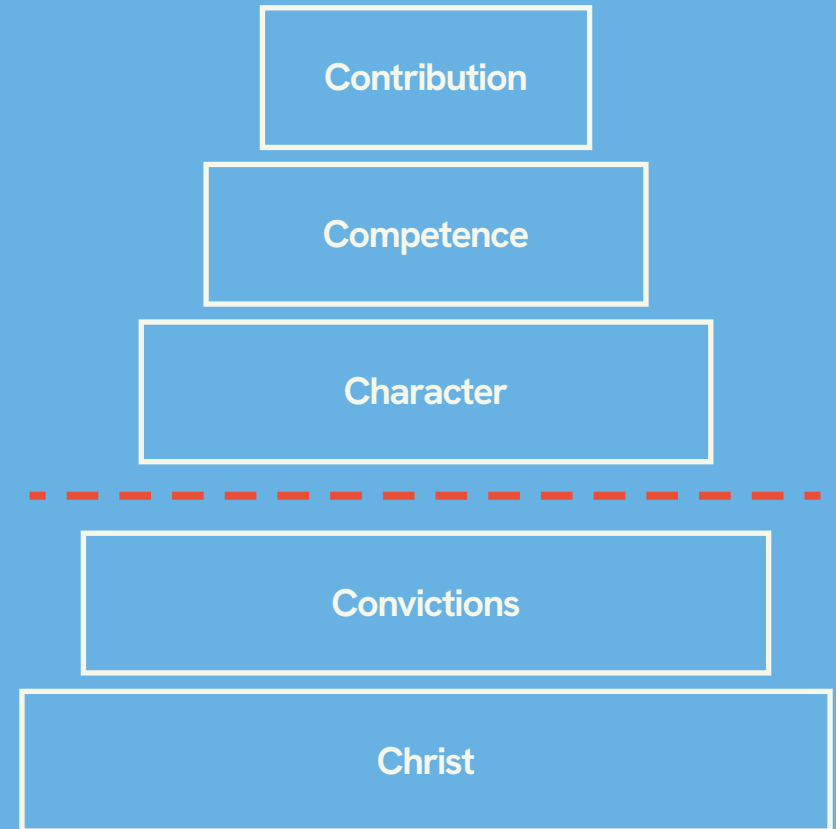

How can we be effective leaders (people who make their best contribution) without that contribution being our be all and end all? More positively, how can we be set free to make our best contribution as leaders, whatever the circumstances?

The Nitty Gritty

In order to gain the most from Connect, it is important to know the following:

- ▷ We require you to treat all aspects of Connect like any other job working with an atmosphere of professionalism, allowing your year to be something that is transferable onto any CV and that would be seen as highly valuable to any future employer.
- ▷ Participants of the Connect Internship are employed for a minimum of three days/week.
- ▷ Expect to also spend the other two days/week on the different elements of the Training Programme.
- ▷ Depending on the specific Internship, Connect will run from the final week in August to the end of the following July. Although some elements of the Training Programme may extend into August.
- ▷ The Internship is normally with a local setting that you are already familiar with, though not all participants have fitted this pattern. The possibility of moving areas or doing alternative internships with other organisations is discussed as part of the application process.

- ▷ Like all Navigator representatives, the Connect Internship is self funded. This is done through raising an agreed budget, which is discussed more on the Ministry Partner Development page.

- ▷ The aim is that all Connect interns are fully funded by the start of their Connect year. This means that after applicants are accepted, there will be Ministry Partner Development training in June, followed by a season of building a team of financial and prayer partners over the summer, prior to the Connect year beginning.
- ▷ Participants may be required to complete a criminal record check (DBS in England/Wales, PVG in Scotland) in order to work with minors or vulnerable adults.

Ministry Partner Development

Having to rely on God to provide for my financial needs for Connect was daunting initially but became a really exciting experience as I saw for myself that his promise to meet all our needs is reliable. This experience turned my faith in that promise from theory into reality and is something I still look back on now to strengthen my faith in times of doubt.

Why?

For many people money can be a taboo subject that we don't like to talk about, let alone ask others to share some of it with us. However, partnering with people financially is an intentional aspect of Connect and has often been significant in building character and faith for those who do the year.

Each participant on the Connect Internship is responsible for developing a team of partners who will pray for and financially support them, according to an approved budget.

Fundraising is proclaiming what we believe in such a way that we offer other people an opportunity to participate with us in our vision and mission.

Whilst this can sometimes initially be scary for people, it is a valuable and integral part of the year, with help, support and guidance being given throughout. Connect operates on the principle that 'workers should be given what they need' (Matt 10:10), and that interns are part of a global church of people seeking to use the resources we have for God's glory. We believe all money is God's and that God is generous. And therefore, we see it as a privilege to bring people with us on our journey of ministry, allowing them to partner in the gospel with us through both prayer and financial support.

Budget

Thanks to generous grant funders and individual donors to the Navigators (who together contribute £6000 towards your year) the annual budget that a Connect intern working 3-days/week needs to

raise is typically around £1,000/month. The exact figure will be agreed with your supervisor depending on your personal circumstances and choice of Summer Training Programme. The budget covers a small shared services contribution (currently 8%) on donations processed via the Navigators UK office, which contributes towards the essential central services of the charity. The rest of the money raised will fund your salary for day-to-day living expenses and the £660 cost of participating in the subsidised Training Programme.

Gift aid

As the Navigators UK is a registered charity, most donations made are eligible for Gift Aid. This is a government scheme enabling registered charities to reclaim tax on donations made by a UK taxpayer, effectively increasing the amount of the donation. The Gift Aid rate is currently 25%, so for every £1 donated, the Gift Aid would be 25p.

Training

In June, before Connect officially begins, you will be given help in expressing your vision and what you will be doing in the year ahead, and how to ask people if they would like to partner with you. This training will include studying the biblical basis for God's generosity and support raising, along with practical help of how to go about it. Following this training there is an expectation that Connect Interns will spend time over the summer building a team of partners, with the aim of being fully funded by 1st September.

How to Apply

The deadline to apply for Connect is the end of February.

If you wish to apply for Connect, there are some steps to follow:

- 1 Discuss your interest with a local Navigator representative.
- 2 Apply for an application pack by filling in the form at: navigators.co.uk/connect
- 3 Pray about it and discuss it with friends, family and your church.
- 4 When your application has been received, application forms are processed and external references requested.
- 5 Interviews are conducted in March to help assess if Connect is the right thing for you.
- 6 By April, the Connect Training Team send a letter of acceptance to successful candidates.
- 7 Further details are sent out, including practical details to get set up for the year ahead, initial training materials and details of the Ministry Partner Development training. Local supervision arrangements are also clarified.
- 8 MPD training will be in Birmingham on 10th-11th June. Please keep these dates free if you apply.

Beyond Connect

Although we think it will be a significant one, Connect is just one short step in your life. In previous years Connect interns have gone on to serve God in different capacities, be that moving to another country, working for a local church or in the charity sector, setting up their own business or focusing on a traditional career.

Some have continued to work with and be developed and trained by the Navigators for a further year of Connect, called C2. This builds on relationships built during Connect, deepens and consolidates the

theological training of the Connect year and explores what longer term ministry might look like. A C2 intern would normally increase to working 4 days/week.

Wherever you end up, our prayer is that Connect sets you up for a lifetime of being surrendered to Jesus, a skilled worker in his harvest field with a compassion for the lost to make a difference wherever God may lead you.
